#### **INFORMATION ON ACCUPLACER/ASSESSMENTS**

The placement testing/assessment is an advising tool used by Student Services to test all new students, with the exceptions of:

• Transfer students that have completed passing credits in college level Math and/or English.

• Returning students who have completed passing credits in college level Math and/ or English. If it has been more than 5 years since you have completed passing credits, you may need to take the Accuplacer test.

• Have taken ACT/SAT.

Information from the placement test/assessment will be used to assess which courses will be mandatory for the students to assure academic success. Students who do not score at the level needed for Math and English will be required to enroll in the respective developmental course(s).

ACCUPLACER – a standardize, multiple choice test. Completed on campus. Student will receive scores immediately. <u>Links to practice for Accuplacer</u> • <u>Reading</u> • <u>Writing</u> • <u>Math</u>

**LLTC DEVELOPED ASSESSMENT** - The English placement assessment involves writing a 250-500 word essay on a topic predetermined by the English department. The Math placement assessment involves a series of math questions at various level of skill.


**OPT OUT** – a student can choose to opt out of testing if they feel they need developmental courses.
