This reduction is based on both the need to streamline our institutional and learning processes and the reccomendation of the HLC team during the April 2019 visit. 



### Historical Data Trends: IPEDS for the Last (almost)Decade





In IPEDS the full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment (Total FTE) is calculated as the sum of the institution's FTE undergraduate enrollment and FTE graduate enrollment (as calculated from or reported on the 12-month Enrollment component). Undergraduate and graduate FTE are estimated using 12-month instructional activity (credit and/or contact hours).




- Apply Anishinaabe ways of knowing and being in order to live a good life in a global society.

The Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) is a system of survey components that collects data from about 7,500 institutions that provide postsecondary education across the United States. IPEDS collects institution-level data on students (enrollment and graduation rates), student charges, program completions, faculty, staff, and finances. These data are used at the federal and state level for policy analysis and development; at the institutional level for benchmarking and peer analysis; and by students and parents, through the College Navigator (http://collegenavigator.ed.gov), to aid in the college search process.
